In a nostalgic pastiche of early '90s pop culture, three storytellers make it through the wilderness of leopard-print leotards and Jane Fonda workout videos as they relive the awkwardness of early sexual awakenings.

The East Coast premier of Gina Young's *Tales of a Fourth Grade Lesbo* thoughtfully – at times hilariously – captures the joys and the torments of adolescence familiar to any kid who's ever been uninvited from a slumber party.



**T**HE world is abuzz over a scientific miracle: two genetically identical humans, unrelated but more twin than twins, exactly the same in every way! No one can tell them apart... except journalist Karen Sayer, whose declaration to the brainwashed public that they don't look anything alike destroys her career and throws her sanity into question.
